 - Michel Mallet: Winter often had concerns around weather delays and travel costs. Karin James/Isolde Winter: the funding from Netzwerk Deutsch is the major barrier that demands how we spend our money and arrange our events.
- Live survey results: Montreal and Toronto remain top choices for conference host cities for those who are able to attend in person. Claudia

- Hein: western representation would certainly be stronger if we are able to come back west.
- Re: registration. Specific question around if folks are staying for meals, not just attending the event, in order to minimize food waste.
- Re: program. Saturday is a very long day indeed. What can/should be done?
- Re: schedule. Film: content was tough/heavy for some. Could we consider a different type of entertainment?
 - Should we consider eliminating the cultural component to have only the Empfang, while ensuring that a festive atmosphere that facilitates the networking/exchange as well?
 - Could the cultural component be something recorded/hybrid (Berlin Philharmonic, etc.) which allows attendees to enjoy a break while also network?
 - Should it be moved to a different time of day?
 - Could music students or a pianist come for the music? Maybe not during the Empfang.
- Questions about the hotel. No major concerns. An option for a hostel may be available in future years.
